Subject: Major Achievements of Department of Commerce during July 2023

# I. Trade Performance

- Merchandise exports during July 2023 were recorded at USD 32.25 Billion.
- Under merchandise exports, 11 of the 30 key sectors exhibited positive growth in July 2023 as compared to same period last year (July 2022). These include Iron Ore (962.82%), Oil Meals (34.24%), Oil Seeds (32.83%), Ceramic Products & Glassware (20.82%), Fruits & Vegetables (18.94%), Electronic Goods (13.09%), Coffee (11.9%), Cotton Yarn/Fabs./Made-Ups, Handloom Products Etc. (6.62%), Rice (5.38%), Cereal Preparations & Miscellaneous Processed Items (2.56%) and Drugs & Pharmaceuticals (0.09%).
- Exports of Electronic goods increased by 13.09 percent during July 2023 at USD 2.05 Billion as compared to USD 1.81 Billion in July 2022. During April-July 2023 electronic goods exports were recorded at USD 9.01 Billion as compared to USD 6.55 Billion during April-July 2022, registering a growth of 37.60 percent.

### **II. Export Infrastructure**

• 18<sup>th</sup> Meeting of Empowered Committee on Trade Infrastructure for Export Scheme (TIES) was held on 14<sup>th</sup> July 2023.

### III. SEZ

• Development Commissioners of various SEZs during the month of July, 2023 have approved the proposals of investment of Rs. 3412.68 crore, which will also provide employment to approx. 24708 persons.

# **IV. Export Promotion**

- Chemicals and Allied Products Export Promotion Council (CAPEXIL) organised a webinar 14th July 2023 on "Authorised Economic Operator Scheme".
- Basic Chemicals, Cosmetics & Dyes Export Promotion Council (CHEMEXIL) organised a webinar on 14<sup>th</sup> July 2023 on "Transporting Dangerous Goods-The Challenges and The Need for Managing Them" and an online interactive session on opportunities for Indian chemical industry on 18<sup>th</sup> July 2023 and CHEMXIL also participated in China Interdye Event 2023 from 26<sup>th</sup> 28<sup>th</sup> July 2023.
- Plastics Export Promotion Council (PLEXCONCIL) organisd a meeting with industry members on 14<sup>th</sup> July 2023 on export strategy and a webinar on "Areas of Disputes under GST regime" to create awareness among the trade about the major area of disputes under GST Regime on 7<sup>th</sup> July 2023.

#### V. MPEDA

- MPEDA has enrolled 170 farms, formed 12 new cluster farms and organised 106 campaigns benefitting 986 beneficiaries during July 2023.
- 18 exporters, 2 processing plants, 2 handling facilities, 3 storages and 2 peeling sheds were issued certificate of registration. Currently 431 EU approved seafood processing establishments and 69 EU approved cold storages are present.

# VI. Export Credit and Insurance

• During July 2023, ECGC Ltd. has supported exports of Rs 52,257 Crore, earned a premium of Rs 93.37 Crore, issued 971 policies, added 1,379 new buyers and settled claims worth Rs 24.22 Crore.

#### VII. Bilateral Trade

- CIM Level Meetings:
  - a. On 4<sup>th</sup> July 2023, CIM held a brief meeting with the Australian Minister for Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry in New Delhi.
  - b. CIM visited London during  $10^{th} 12^{th}$  July 2023. Meetings were held with UK's Secretary of State for Business and Trade; UK PM's Chief Economic Adviser and Business and Industry stakeholders.
  - c. During 11<sup>th</sup> -12<sup>th</sup> July, 2023 the CIM visited London, and met EFTA delegation accompanied by the industry stakeholders from Pharmaceutical, Machinery and Electronics of EFTA States to expedite the India-EFTA TEPA Negotiations.
  - d. Bilateral meeting between CIM and Vice Chancellor and Minister for Economic Affairs and Climate Action, Germany was held on 20<sup>th</sup> July 2023 at Vanijya Bhawan, New Delhi to discuss bilateral trade and investment issues.
  - e. CIM and Canadian Trade Minister reviewed the negotiation through VC on 3<sup>rd</sup>, 8<sup>th</sup> and 28<sup>th</sup> July 2023 to discuss the ongoing India-Canada CEPA/EPTA and other issues related to Canada.
- Commerce Secretary Level Meetings:

During 17<sup>th</sup>-19<sup>th</sup> July 2023 Commerce Secretary hold meetings with UK Delegation lead by Permanent Secretary of the Department for Business and Trade including Director General for Trade Negotiations; Chief Executive and Comptroller General, IP Office and Director General for Borders & Trade were held in UK. A luncheon meeting with UK PM's Economic Adviser was also held.
  - b. A meeting to discuss bilateral issues was held by Commerce Secretary with Foreign Secretary, Royal Government of Bhutan on 29<sup>th</sup> July 2023 in New Delhi.
  - c. A meeting was held on 7<sup>th</sup> July 2023 under the co-chairmanship of Commerce Secretary and Secretary (East), MEA with the Ambassadors/Heads of Indian Missions of LAC countries in India and the Heads of Indian Missions in LAC (hybrid mode) to mobilize participation for the CII India LAC Conclave.

  - a. An EFTA delegation visited India during 3<sup>rd</sup>— 6<sup>th</sup> July 2023 for a round of discussions under India-EFTA TEPA negotiations; and negotiations were conducted in New Delhi.
  - b. 6<sup>th</sup> India-Arab Partnership Conference on "New Horizons in Investment, Trade & Services" was held from 11<sup>th</sup> -12<sup>th</sup> July 2023 in New Delhi.
  - c. The 4<sup>th</sup> round of India-Australia CECA negotiations were held during 12<sup>th</sup> 21<sup>st</sup> July, 2023 in New Delhi.
  - d.  $9^{th}$  round of negotiation of India- Canada EPTA was held in from  $13^{th} 21^{st}$  July 2023 through virtual mode.

# X. G-20

- 3<sup>rd</sup> Meeting of the Trade and Investment Working Group (TIWG) was held at Kevadia, Gujarat. Annex documents to the Ministerial statement were negotiated for two days from 10<sup>th</sup> -12<sup>th</sup> July 2023.
- 4<sup>th</sup> TIWG is planned from 21<sup>st</sup> -22<sup>nd</sup> August 2023 followed by a Ministerial Meeting from 24<sup>th</sup> -25<sup>th</sup> August at Jaipur.

### XI. GeM

- On 6<sup>th</sup> July 2023, GeM organized Chintan Shivir at the Constitution Club of India, New Delhi. The event was attended by Buyers/Sellers, Associations and GeM Officials. This collaborative approach was intended to identify additional features and functionalities to make GeM even more Transparent, Efficient & Inclusive.
- Vivad se Vishwas- II (Contractual Dispute) functionality has launched a very useful feature into GeM to resolve buyer and seller disputes up to 500 Cr.
- A 2-day National Level Workshop was organised by CSC e-Governance Services India Ltd. (CSC SPV) in association with GeM for CSC State SPOCs at IIT, Delhi during 19<sup>th</sup> – 20<sup>th</sup> July 2023.
- During the month 178 training sessions and 30 events were conducted for various Buyer and Seller organizations with a total participant count of 9996 with 7700+ Buyers and 2200+ sellers.
