INTRODUCTORY NOTE:

1. This document sets out **Oman's** Schedule of specific commitments under the Trade in Services chapter of the India-Oman Comprehensive Economic Partnership Agreement (CEPA). This introductory note should be regarded as forming an integral part of Oman's Schedule.
2. The Schedule has been prepared based on the Services Sectoral Classification List in document MTN.GNS/W/120. References to CPC codes refer to the CPC codes as used in the Provisional Central Product Classification (Statistical Papers Series M No. 77, Department of International Economic and Social Affairs, Statistical Office of the United Nations, New York, 1991) and are meant to define the scope of the commitments, unless otherwise stated, except for sectors where "CPC Ver. 2" is indicated. Where "CPC Ver.2" is indicated, the reference is to the Central Product Classification (Statistical Papers Series M No. 77, Ver. 2, Department of International Economic and Social Affairs, Statistical Office of the United Nations, New York, 2008).
3. The Oman reserves the right to make technical changes to this Schedule to correct any errors, omissions, or inaccuracies.
